Main Divide is always punching above its weight and is often near the front of the pack in tastings, snapping at the heels of their premium Pegasus wines. Simon liked this wine's full colour, from lemon to buttercup. It was a weighty, quite complex style, with rich, mineral, zesty acids. And considered it oily, with stonefruit/pineapple aromatics. Again, there were botrytis notes. It was dry, full and delicious, he said. Rod noted lifted spice, Turkish Delight, rose, ripe pear, cinnamon, spice and a nice, dry, long palate.

Elegantly opulent, this attractive pinot gris is filled with ripe stone fruit, baked pear, floral and flinty characters. The palate delivers plenty of succulent fruit flavours, beautifully framed by silky texture and well-integrated acidity. There is a hint of sweetness on the palate but the wine finishes long and pleasing dry. Off-dry. At its best: now to 2019.
